Numeracy

The class will focus on place value before moving onto addition and subtraction.

Place Value

- Read, write and order numbers
- Round numbers to the nearest 100/1000/10000/1000000

Addition and Subtraction

- Solve addition and subtraction problems using written and mental strategies.
- Successfully use a calculator to add, and subtract.

Mental maths and problem solving skills will be visited consistently throughout the term with our focus being on quick recall of times tables and solving problems in a 'real life' context.

<u>Health and Wellbeing</u>

Pupils will engage with the '8 Wellbeing Indicators' and will explore how the indicators can help us to keep on top of our social, emotional and physical wellbeing. Pupils will focus on skills such as: team work & coordination during both indoor and outdoor PE slots. Our focus in Health & Wellbeing will be on emotional literacy through which children will be encouraged to think about a range of emotions and how to identify them in themselves and others.

<u>Homework</u>

<u>Science</u>

This term Primary 7/6 will be investigating natural materials and will be going onto create some chemical reactions.
