

Maths

The class will focus on place value before moving onto addition and subtraction.

Place Value

- Read, write and order numbers
- Round numbers to the nearest 100/1000/10000/1000000

Addition and Subtraction

- Solve addition and subtraction problems using written and mental strategies.
- Successfully use a calculator to add, and subtract.

Homework - Homework will be given out on a Friday, due the following Thursday. Homework activities will include a maths task, reading, topic and spelling. Please sign homework diaries each week as this will show the 'Go for Green' record.

Literacy

The class are reading the novel 'Divided City' by Thersa Breslin. This will involve independent reading and class discussions. During our taught writing sessions we will focus on personal recounts and fictional narrative writing. Weekly spelling words and grammar lessons will also feature.

Health and Wellbeing
