

Maths & Numeracy

The class revise division in January, working towards dividing up to 3 or 4 digits by a single digit.

We will then move onto fractions and decimals. We will find a fraction of a number, add, subtract and order decimals up to one decimal place and convert proper to improper fractions. Some will work with decimals up to 2 decimal places and will work on simplifying and equivalency in fractions. Often, children find these areas challenging and your support is, as always, welcomed.

Literacy


Pupils will work through the spelling programme at their own level. Spelling, handwriting and grammar lessons will be a weekly feature. Pupils will be reading 'Wonder' at home, with adult support. In class, we will build upon and enhance reading through questioning, Bloom's Buttons and related tasks.

We will be learning and using Scots language in the classroom; not only through the learning of Scots poetry, but also through daily literacy tasks. We will also visit our local library.

We will continue to improve writing through Talk for Writing, Active Literacy and VCOP strategies and will look at letter writing.
