Numeracy

The class will focus on place value before moving onto addition and subtraction.

<u>Place Value</u> - children will:

- Read, write and order numbers
- Round numbers to the nearest 100/1,000/10,000/1,000,000/100,000,000

Addition and Subtraction - children will:

- Solve addition and subtraction problems using written and mental strategies.
- Successfully use a calculator to add, and subtract.

Pupils will continue to engage with 'Big Maths' on a daily basis in order to increase their speed and accuracy when recalling tables facts. Problem solving skills will be visited throughout the term with the focus being on solving problems in a 'real life' context.

<u>Health and Wellbeing</u>

Pupils will engage with the '8 Wellbeing Indicators' and will explore how the indicators can help to keep on top of their social, emotional and physical wellbeing. Pupils will focus on skills such as: team work & coordination during both indoor and outdoor PE sessions. Our focus in Health & Wellbeing will be on protective behaviours through which children will be encouraged to think about a range of emotions and how to identify them in themselves.
