

## Numeracy

### Maths

Pupils will be learning to:

#### Place Value & Decimals

- Understand place & value up to 6 digits and 3 decimal places. (beyond this for some)
- Use formal methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication & division to calculate decimal sums.
- Build their knowledge of mental maths strategies.
- Apply partitioning strategies & the formal method with decimal sums to make money calculations.

#### Measurement

- Recognise and order metric measurements.
- Apply decimal learning to convert metric measurements



#### Multiples, Factors and Primes

- Recognise number patterns in and beyond all multiplication tables. (Learn Its)
- Identify some multiples, factors, square numbers and square roots. (CLIC)

Pupils will continue to engage with 'Big Maths' in order to increase their speed and accuracy when recalling tables facts. Problem solving skills will be visited throughout the term with the focus being on solving

### Writing & Film Workshops

Throughout November, children will participate in a writing stimulus workshop led by Scottish Wildlife & Badger trust with Year of Stories 2022 Community Stories Fund. The experience will culminate with the class sharing their writing & films with the school at a whole school pupil assembly.

### Science (with Miss Forbes)

In Science, pupils will be learning about the Circulatory and Respiratory System.

## Social Studies

This term, Room 10 will be stepping back in time by investigating the life and times of Mary, Queen of Scots. Through this topic, children will develop their skills in:

- Using both primary and secondary sources of evidence in an investigation about the past.
- Placing an event appropriately within a historical timeline.
- Describing at least two ways in which past events or the actions of individuals or groups have shaped Scottish society.
- Describing and discussing at least three similarities and differences between their own life and life in a past society.

## Literacy and Languages

This term, pupils will be reading a group text in class ('Ghost Boys'/'The Crossover'/'The Suitcase Kid') and will undertake tasks related to their reading focussing on predicting, synthesising, determining importance and inferring. During our taught writing sessions we will focus on instructional and narrative writing as well as some poetry. Weekly spelling words, comprehension and grammar lessons will also feature. Children should continue with a personal reader at home. This does not need to be novels - recipes, news articles and magazines are all valuable texts to be reading!

### French

Pupils will learn about French food and drink this term as well as consolidating basic greetings, numbers, days of the week and months of the year. Children will design a French menu whilst also learning some 'festive' words and phrases.



### Health and Wellbeing

Pupils will continue to engage with the '8 Wellbeing Indicators' and will explore how the indicators can help us to keep on top of our social, emotional and physical wellbeing. We will be focussing on the 'Healthy,' 'Achieving' and 'Nurtured' indicators this term. P.E days remain as a Monday (indoor) and Friday (MUGA). Woodland day remains a Wednesday.
