Primary 4 Homework Overview

- Each week your child will be assigned a homework task for Numeracy, Spelling, Reading and Listening & Talking. A class project or tasks for other curricular areas will be distributed when relevant.
- Homework will be distributed on a Friday and collected on a Thursday. This provides time over the weekend for those families and pupils with weekday commitments. Homework club will also be available for support.
- A sticker in the homework diary will inform you and your child of the tasks for that week.
- After homework tasks are completed, please sign your child's diary. Diaries are a great way to communicate so please write any queries or comments, and ask your child about their 'behaviour' leaves.

Homework Tasks

- **Spelling-** Different weekly tasks linked with learning in class. Tasks are on a 4 week rotationplease see front of homework jotter for description.
- **Reading-** Assigned pages/chapters or personal reading.
- **Numeracy-** Mixture of worksheets, websites, RM Easimaths and Big Maths Learn Its. Google Classroom (accessed through Pupil Glow Log in) will provide pupils with sound files for Big Maths Learn Its.
- Talk Homework- Weekly discussion.

Numeracy

This term our focus will be on Place Value. Pupils will revise numbers up to 1000 and progress onto numbers up to 10,000. Pupils will develop skills in estimating, rounding and sequencing. Increasing and decreasing a number by a ten, hundred and thousand will also be explored. Pupils will focus on reading, writing, ordering and partitioning values up to 10,000.

Pupils will also revise their 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times tables through Supermovers and quick starter tasks. Big Maths will be started and Learns Its will be uploaded to Google Classroom for support.

Health and Wellbeing

As a class we will create our Class Charter in line with the school's values and the UN Rights of the Child. Through the Protective Behaviours programme we will discuss Children's Rights including 'The right to feel safe' and discuss our different emotions. As a class, we will focus on fostering new relationships with the peers in our classroom and the importance of friendship, kindness and respect. In gym and MUGA, pupils will develop their teamwork skills and ball handling skills. Topic- 'Our Community'

Pupils will learn about Lanark through a focus on housing and mapping skills. Our topic will make comparisons between Lanark and the City of Glasgow.

<u>P.E.</u> Gym days are Wednesday (indoors) and Thursday (outdoors).

Pupils should store their gym kit in school.

Old trainers and joggers may be brought in for outdoor gym.

<u>Literacy</u>

Stage 4 spelling will be introduced and pupils will begin to familiarise themselves with the different activities related to the new spelling programme. For example, pupils will learn how to diacritically mark words, identify words in a phoneme story and identify phonemes that have the same sound but are represented differently.

As a class we will be reading 'Esio Trot' by Roald Dahl. This will be an opportunity to learn new comprehension strategies and complete related tasks.

Letter formation and jotter presentation will be a focus for Handwriting. In writing, we will revise the use of capital letters and full stops, and our main writing pieces will relate to the text 'Esio Trot' and personal recounts.

Science and Art and Design will be taught by Miss Forbes this term..
