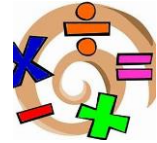


Numeracy

Children will be able to:



Place Value

- Read, write and order numbers up to 9,999 in words and digits.
- Partition, sort and order numbers up to 9,999.
- Use appropriate vocabulary to describe and compare numbers.

Addition and Subtraction

- Revise addition and subtraction facts to 100.
- Work on doubles and near doubles within 100 for quick recall of facts.
- Introduce addition and subtraction to 1000.

Pupils will continue to engage with 'Big Maths' to increase their speed and accuracy when recalling tables and number bond facts. Problem solving skills will be visited throughout the term with the focus being on solving problems in a 'real life' context.

ICT

Children will use Chromebooks, iPads and class computers on a weekly basis to develop their ICT skills. This will include effectively 'logging on,' using internet browsers for topic research and word processing.

Social Studies

This term, Room 6 will be stepping back in time by investigating the history of New Lanark.

Children will:

- Comment on important figures such as Robert Owen and David Dale and their impact on society.
- Identify the difference between a more and less trustworthy source.
- Produce a short timeline.
- Relate the history of New Lanark through media such as drawings, models or writing.
- Draw comparisons between modern life and life from the past.



Literacy and Languages

This term, Room 6 will read 'Billionaire Boy' by David Walliams as well as engaging with a group text. Children will undertake tasks related to their reading focussing on finding information and sharing their thoughts about characters and setting. In taught writing, every Thursday, we will be looking at areas for children to expand their VCOP (Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation), through imaginative and personal stories. Learners will continue working through the spelling programme at their appropriate level. Spelling is completed daily and learners will be supported in using a range of spelling strategies.

French



Pupils will consolidate basic greetings, numbers, colours, days of the week and months of the year.

Health and Wellbeing

Learners will explore their rights and how they link to our school values by creating a Class Charter. Pupils will continue to engage with the 'Wellbeing Indicators' this session and will learn how the indicators can help to audit social, emotional and physical wellbeing. In P.E, children will develop their coordination and teamwork skills through indoor and outdoor activities such as: handball, netball and football.
