#### Wellbeing Indicator of the Month - Healthy

#### **Nurture Principles**

As part of our Health and Wellbeing work to further develop our attachment informed, trauma sensitive approaches to support learners, we have worked on linking the Nurture Principles, in child-friendly language, to our Wellbeing Indicators of the Month.

Our Nurture Principle for this month's theme of **Healthy** is:

The importance of nurture for the development of wellbeing (Nurture helps us feel good in our body and our mind).

We will continue to share these principles throughout the session to make them meaningful not only to our staff and learners, but to parents and carers too.

#### **Loose Parts Play**



We are currently revamping our outdoors and looking to develop our 'Loose Parts Play' area, both in the woodlands and in the outdoor area attached to the playroom. In this area, our early learners can use materials that can be moved around and used in lots of different ways- the versatility of the materials provides our early learners with endless ways to be creative and develop many skills. We are looking for items such as PVC pipes and guttering, logs, cones, crates, wooden blocks, large cardboard tubes (carpet rolls), buttons, shells, small stones/pebbles/rocks- the list is endless! #### **Visits to Crosslaw Care Home**

As you may know, over the last few sessions we visited McClymont House as part of an intergenerational project. Now that McClymont House has closed, we will begin visits to another local care home, Crosslaw.

Learners will attend in 'teams' (from 1.15pm) every two weeks and dates as follows:

- Blue Team- Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> Nov
- Red Team- Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> Nov
- All Teams- Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> Dec (Christmas)
- Yellow Team- Wednesday 15th Jan
- Green Team- Wednesday 29th Jan

Please note that on your child's visit date- they require a change of outdoor shoes and jacket (just incase they're Woodlands clothing is too dirty!

#### **Book Club**

As you may recall from last session, we operate a weekly Book Club that is run by a volunteer and former parent.

The Book Club involves children bringing in **50p each week for three weeks**. Once £1.50 has been saved\*, children can choose from a wide range of books. Money is collected every Friday and we are delighted that it started again.

The Book Club allows children to purchase high quality books at a low price which encourages a love of reading; supports the cost of the school day; and promotes a habit of saving (for this reason we do ask that children do not bring any more than 50p in any one week so that they are saving towards their chosen book). Mrs Lyons will be there to collect at the 'Drop-off' time.
