

Numeracy

In Numeracy, pupils will be working on Multiplication and Division. Pupils will work at the appropriate stage and pace for them. They will work on:

- Can multiply up to 4 digits by a single digit using the standard written method.
- Can mentally multiply and divide 2 digit numbers more confidently by a single digit.
- Can multiply and divide up to 4 digits and 2 decimal places by a single digit using the standard written method and including word problems.
- Can multiply and divide 3 digits by 2 digits, incorporating word problems, using the standard written method.
- Can multiply and divide 3 digits by 2 digits, incorporating word problems, using the standard written method.

Learners should continue to practise their 'Learn Its' weekly alongside their Numeracy homework. These are based on fractions, decimals and percentages this term. Learning these will make their classwork much easier to tackle!

Topic

Pupils will be working on a 'Natural Disasters' topic this term. They will be learning about a wide range of natural disasters, how they happen and the impact they have on communities. We are excited to partner with the St Andrews University's GeoBus staff who will be visiting our class and taking us through some Natural Disasters themed workshops.

PE (Cross Country)

This term marks the start of our P6 and P7 cross country training sessions. These will be held at Kildare Park twice each week. Those who do not want to participate will participate in a MUGA session or indoor PE session.

Homework will continue to be issued each Monday and due on Friday. Please continue to support pupils to complete their homework as this consolidates learning from the classroom. The pupils will be encouraged to do their homework in order to develop good habits and time management skills for LGS.
